**Gokh Amin Alshaif** is a PhD student in the Department of History at UCSB. Her research focuses on gender, race, and racialization in the Arabian Peninsula and the broader Middle East. Her dissertation "Native Outsiders: Black Yemenis in 19th and 20th Century Yemen" is a social history of Yemen's marginalized Black Muhamasheen community. It draws on Middle East Studies, Indian Ocean Studies, and Black Studies to recenter Yemen as a global anchor of East Africa, the Middle East, and South Asia. She holds an MA in Global & International Studies and BAs in Political Science and Religious Studies.
